What is an Association?

The IRS defines an association as:


1. A way to raise more tax revenue
2. A social/professional club
3. A group of like-minded people banded together for a specific purpose

The Value of Associations

- Members, society, legislators recognize the strength of associations.
- In order to be effective, an association must establish....
 - Credibility
 - Communication
 - Consensus

Association Composition

- It's not unusual for an association to represent many diverse members with one common denominator.
 - The more specialized, the less number of members/potential members
 - The less specialized, the more members/potential members

Ohio ACTE Composition

- Many different parts of career-technical and adult education coming together.
- Different delivery methods for CTE.
- No section is more important than the other, but dependent on each other to play their part.

Orchestra



Ohio ACTE Orchestra

- An orchestra is a group of musicians, each playing a different instrument, coming together to create beautiful music – what do they have in common? They are musicians
- Ohio ACTE is a group of educators coming together to insure students have access to career-technical programs. What do they have in common? – Career-technical education.

An Orchestra Includes:

- **Strings**
 - Violin
 - Cello
 - Viola
- **Brass**
 - French Horn
 - Tuba
 - Trumpet or Cornet
 - Trombone
- **Woodwinds**
 - Clarinet
 - Flute
 - Oboe

Ohio ACTE President/Officers:

- Conductor:
 - Leads the organization
 - Identifies the right “music”
 - Responsible for ensuring everyone plays their part
 - Puts Committee leadership in place
 - Represents Ohio ACTE in legislative and other issues
- Ohio ACTE Officers:
 - Assist the President
 - Provide perspective
 - Day-to-day operations

Division Officers:

- “First Chair”:
 - Set the tone for Division members
 - Offer input on musical choice
 - Responsible for ensuring everyone plays their part in their Division
 - Reminds Division members they are part of a bigger whole
 - Circulates the music, information

Ohio ACTE Members:

- Musicians:
 - Support the conductor – choose the conductor
 - Play the right “music”
 - Responsible for understanding the issues
 - Must proactively remain informed
 - Represents Ohio ACTE in legislative and other issues

Purpose of Empowerment:

- Composers
 - Give input on the direction, tone, pace of the music
 - There are many different strategic directions, provide leadership with insight
 - Circulates the music, information
 - Applaud the conductor, musicians, members, officers

Executive Director:

- Bass Drum

- The bass drum is the lowest keyed drum in the orchestra.
- It does not have a definite pitch.
- Keeps the orchestra on track and “moving” at the appropriate pace for the music selection
