# Legislation

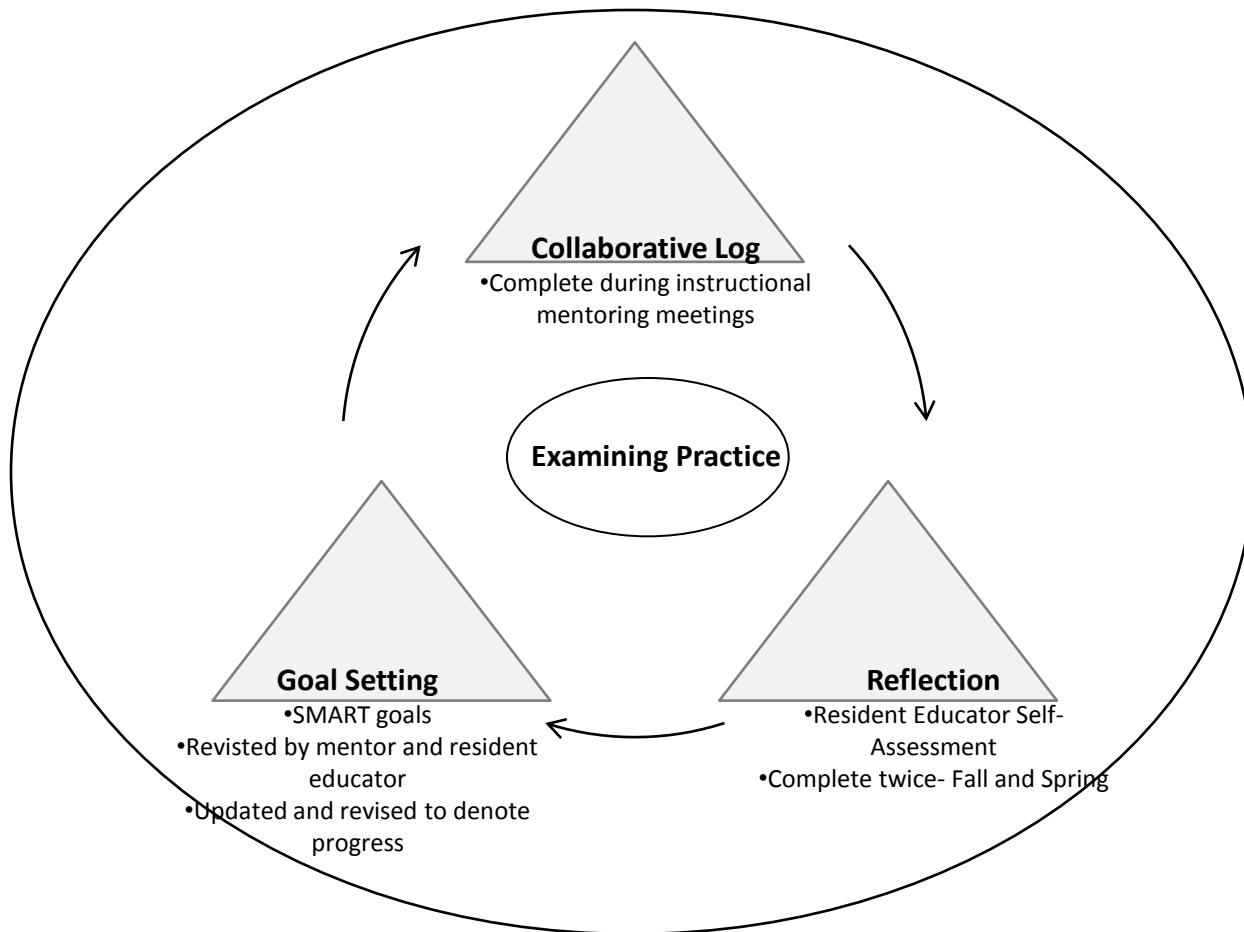
In July 2009, Gov. Ted Strickland signed Ohio House Bill 1, which mandates a new licensure system for teachers, including a Resident Educator license.

In the Governor's plan, the Ohio Department of Education (ODE) will develop a Resident Educator Program to be effective by January 2011.

# ***Transition Resident Educator Program***

During the interim period of July 1, 2009, to Jan. 1, 2011, a transition plan will allow teachers who hold a two-year provisional license to advance to a five-year professional license.

# ***Transition Program Formative Assessment System*** 2009-2011

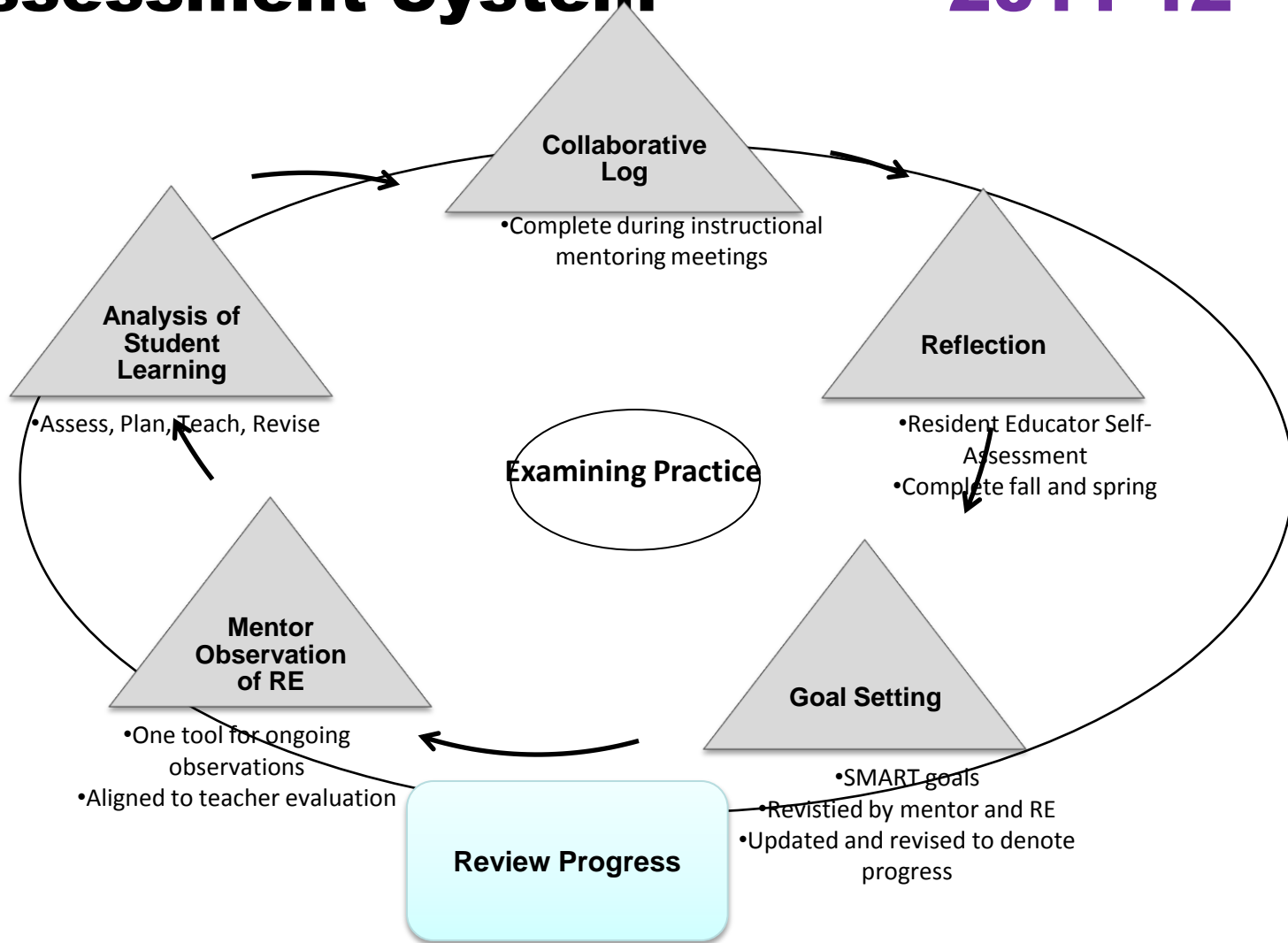

# Timelines

## 2010-11

- Field test tools and protocols through Centers of Practice
- Provide opportunities for stakeholder feedback
- Plan for implementation – district information sessions, webinars, etc
- Build capacity in mentor trainers and regional service providers to support full implementation
- Provide mentor training and program coordinator/administrator information sessions and training

## 2011-12

- State-wide implementation with ongoing training, support and technical assistance from regional service providers and ODE.

# **Resident Educator Program and CTE**

- **CT representation at all levels of the process.**
- **CT Rt B licensure program fits within the Transition and Residency programs.**
- **Licensure FAQs (June 23) includes key points for CT**
  - **#11 Degree requirement for CT teachers remains**
  - **#1 Transition program applies in 2010-11 to all CT teachers on provisional license**

# Licensure FAQs

Updated June 23, 2010

#11 Does a **route B Career Tech teacher** still need to obtain a **degree applicable to the career field, classroom teaching or an area of licensure** at the second renewal of the professional career tech license?

*Yes, this **degree requirement for route B career-technical teachers** will remain. Proposed amended licensure rule 3301-24-08, Professional or Associate License Renewal, has added language specifying that the degree requirement for route B teachers applies only to individuals who received their first route B license **AFTER** this requirement first took effect (12/30/2004).*

# 1 How does the new four year Ohio Resident Educator Program, to begin with the 2011-2012 school year, affect

- Teachers who begin teaching on an **alternative educator license** in 2010-11, or who are in their second year under an alternative educator license in 2010-2011?
- Teachers who begin teaching on a **provisional route B career-technical license** in 2010-11, or who are in their second, third or fourth year under a provisional route B license during that year, but who have not yet completed either the old Entry Year Program or the current one year Transition Resident Educator Program?

*Teachers who are in either their first or second year of teaching on an alternative educator license in 2010-2011, and **teachers in either their first, second, third or fourth year of teaching on a provisional route B career-technical license in 2010-2011 may complete the Transition Resident Educator Program during the 2010-2011 school year.***

# **April 2 CT Rt B Information Sheet**

- **Transition Resident Educator Program during 2010-11**
- **New teachers in 2010-11 may be in the Transition Program in their 1<sup>st</sup> year of teaching.**
- **After 2010-11, the Ohio Resident Educator Program will apply to all teachers**
